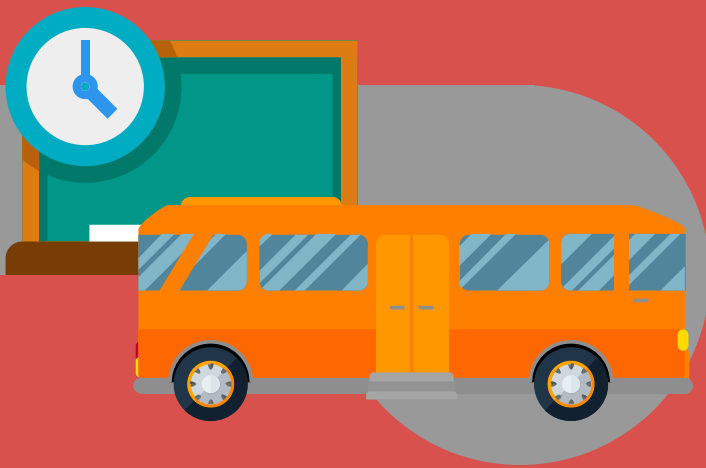


Economic Justice



DC's poorest families have seen a dramatic loss of income since the Great Recession, as their income is now lower than in most major US cities. The District must invest in solutions and ensure companies that are receiving subsidies are actually providing jobs for District workers who most need them.



Economic Development Accountability

We want a tool (Job Quality Assessment & Accountability Tool) to be sure that anytime the DC government “economic development” subsidies to a private company, that we know what kinds of jobs are resulting from these projects. This will help us to see if taxpayers are getting results from the taxpayer dollars that go to private companies.

Cost: \$200,000

Transportation for Adult Learners

Many adult learners currently receive \$50/month from the District to support their commute to and from school. We want to keep this program growing to sufficiently support all adult learners and their programs.

Cost: At least \$1.98 Million
